

Diagnosis at the earliest possible stage allows for early intervention and treatment programmes and a better overall outcome for an individual with FASD. Better understanding of the condition can help parents and professionals cope more appropriately with the child's difficulties. This extends beyond healthcare, for example through development of targeted educational and social support programmes. NICE Briefing Paper, 2019

Despite being a prevalent condition, FASD is largely under-recognised and under-diagnosed. This has not been a part of professionals initial training. The NICE Quality Standard on FASD draft includes “evidence of local arrangements to increase awareness of FASD among healthcare professionals” as a quality measure.
